Gertrude H. Hast Scholarship

Post-Baccalaureate Premedical Students with Indiana Residency



The Gertrude H. Hast Scholarship (Hast) is a scholarship for Indiana residents admitted to the Post-Baccalaureate Premedical Program (PBPM) through University College at Washington University in St. Louis.

The Hast Scholarship pays for \$5,000 toward PBPM tuition for each academic year, and it can be renewed for one additional academic year (maximum award per student over two academic years = \$10,000), as long as the recipient remains in good standing and maintains above a 3.0 GPA. This is a competitive scholarship, with a maximum of three awarded annually. This scholarship is awarded once per year – applicants should apply before the fall scholarship deadline of July 15.

To be considered for the Hast Scholarship, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

1. Indiana residency—all applicants must present proof of Indiana residency
2. Admission into the Post-Baccalaureate Premedical Program at Washington University in St. Louis
3. Minimum 3.0 GPA in prior college work
4. Interview

To apply for the Hast Scholarship, submit the following items by the scholarship deadline of July 15:

- **Gertrude H. Hast Scholarship Application**
- **Essay:** *Please submit a 250 word essay with this application, describing your academic background, goals and financial need*
- **2 Academic Letters of Recommendation:** *These recommendation letters may be the same two recommendations submitted with your Post-Baccalaureate Premedical program application*

Scholarship Policies

- Scholarship recipients must remain in good standing (placement on probation of any kind warrants the removal of the scholarship).
- Scholarship awards can be applied only to courses that are applicable towards the student's degree program.
- Scholarship awards cover tuition only. Lab fees, late fees, books, and other expenses are not covered by this scholarship.
- Scholarship recipients must attain a passing grade in all coursework to remain fully eligible for scholarships in the subsequent semester.
 - Failing a course will jeopardize the student's eligibility for a scholarship in the subsequent semester. Student regains full eligibility only after successfully passing all courses in a given semester.
 - Withdrawing from a course may also impact a student's eligibility for a scholarship in the subsequent semester. Student regains full eligibility only after successfully passing all courses in a given semester.
- Washington University Employees are not eligible for University College scholarships.
